

A delicious meal was served. It was a very fun day. Thanks to all who made it possible.








HISTORIC MOMENT

The next Multi-State will be hosted by Wisconsin Grand Chapter on August 16, 2025. Please plan to attend this event!




















Tamara Shake, AGC Reception






Busy Summer for District #18
