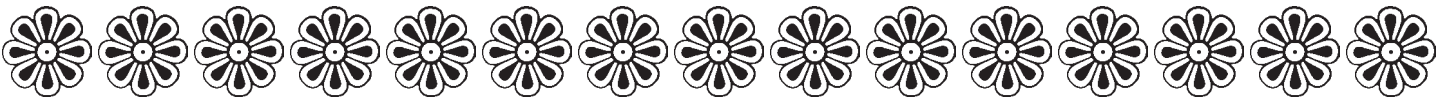

TRANSITION

Transition is something we live with every day. Sometimes we realize it is happening and sometimes we have no recognition at all. Yet every day something around us is changing. Sometimes the transition takes several years, and other times it is abrupt. My father complained for six weeks when his local bank first required pre-numbered checks. Today we think nothing of it, very commonplace, and we have even moved past that by using so many electronic transactions. We accept using plastic cards instead of cash because of convenience, quickness, and safety. You don't carry a thick stack of bills, just swipe a slot or insert the card, the system takes care of the transaction, and you still receive a receipt giving all the details.

My father was against electronic usage. He would never have a computer or a cell phone. He didn't believe you could move money electronically so he never allowed automatic deposits. I do not know what he would do now that all federal funds are moved without a physical check. You see that is transition and most of us never even blinked when we set up our first auto deposit or payment. I lost business from an 81 year old man because the bank where I worked did not offer on line banking. He said he liked to pay his bills about 10:00 P. M., did not like to use time writing checks, and did not see any reason to have to visit a bank when he could do it all on his computer at home. Big contrast, but that is the way we are about change – some make the transition effortlessly and others hold out until there is no other alternative.

A few years ago Indiana Grand Chapter started a transition, moving the STAR-LITE newsletter from written to electronic form. It was a big shift, and accompanied a change to a new website. At the time this transition was made only three percent of the membership was paying the \$10.00 annual subscription fee to receive the newsletter. That is not a large part of the members saying they would pay to have 10 issues per year delivered to their home, business, or lodge. A few members paid for a copy to go their home and paid for another copy to go to their lodge for display. We can accomplish the same thing today by going to indianaoes.org, reading the STAR-LITE on line, or making a copy to read and taking a copy to the lodge.

This year the Star-Lite Committee will transition from being order takers for subscriptions to being reporters for the newsletter. The Worthy Grand Matron believes this is a great way for the news of each District to be broadcast throughout the state and that more members will find out what other areas are doing – to promote Eastern Star, 50 Year Awards, chapter anniversaries, and the list is endless. The Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron will continue their monthly letters to the members. Receptions and Special Events will continue to be printed. District Reporters will be encouraged to take pictures and submit with information. This is transition. It is not perfect. It is not a stopping point. It is change, and it will continue to evolve. Some things will work, maybe for a while, and then they will need to be tweaked again.

Another part of the transition for STAR-LITE is to implement a great new way of informing the membership that the next issue of STAR-LITE is available. It is simply compiling a list of emails formed into a group that is sent saying STAR-LITE is available. A link in the email to click on goes directly to our indianaoes.org website. It may take a while for this to be perfected but we believe it is very workable.

During the year we will investigate what other Grand Chapters are doing with newsletters. We will report on other ways to provide written copies to those members who do not have a computer or access to one. Indiana Grand Chapter took a leap forward when STAR-LITE started being produced electronically. But that is not a final product. The knowledge of our Eastern Star members is outstanding in the understanding of how to enhance this product. We are just now learning how to manage this. At the beginning it was stated that this is transition and it is continuous. We look forward to serving Indiana Eastern Star as your Star-Lite Committee and welcome your comments on how to make this publication better for the membership.

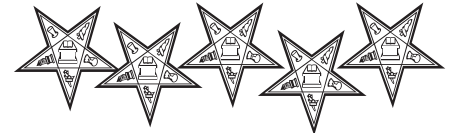

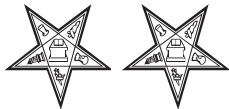
