Greenwood Giving

What do the Saturday before Thanksgiving and the Saturday before Christmas have in common? For 22 years, members from Greenwood O.E.S. have met to shop for groceries on these two Saturdays.

The chairperson of the Recipient Committee of the Philanthropic Project contacts a school near the Masonic Lodge around the 1st of November to obtain names and information of families who have need for assistance with food and at Christmas, clothing and toys for their children. Over the years, a list of groceries to purchase has been compiled by Charles Russell. Members are assigned certain groceries to buy (the quantity determined by the number of families). After assignments are given, the group heads to Aldi's to shop. They line up after obtaining the groceries and a steady stream of Star members go through the checkout. Charles Russell is waiting at the register to pay for the total. All head back to the meeting place, divide the groceries according to families, pack up their family's allotment and head out to deliver the bags and boxes of food. Prior to leaving the meeting place at Thanksgiving, each member (or couple) assigned to a family is given the determined amount of money which is available for clothing and toys for the children with instructions to purchase and wrap these items. When the above grocery process occurs at Christmas, the gifts are distributed to the families along with another supply of food. The by-laws for the Philanthropic Project state that all the money earned during the year for this use must be spent that year, which means the Chapter starts with no funds on January 1st.

The Ways and Means Committee of the Philanthropic Project is assigned the responsibility of taking charge of earning this money. The last 10 or so years, the Chapter has had a chicken-noodle dinner twice a year which has provided the bulk of the funds. Donations come in during the year and usually there are several opportunities for the Chapter to serve special dinners which help with funds. This year (2011), Greenwood Chapter had \$2,713 to split among 8 families.

Whether the families receiving this aid or the Eastern Star members participating in any aspect of accomplishing the purpose of assisting those in need, receive the greatest satisfaction, would have to be questioned. "In as much as you have done it unto the least of these, my brethren, you have done it unto me."
