

Warsaw Celebrates 125 Years



On August 2, 2014, Warsaw Chapter #88, Order of the Eastern Star, celebrated its 125th Anniversary with 75 guest and members present. The program started off with an invocation and everyone joined in giving the Pledge of Allegiance and sang the National Anthem.

The entertainment in accordance to what would have been in 1899 was presented by the "Chain Gang" barbershop quartet, which gave a wonderful program of older and new songs to everyone's delight.

Introductions of distinguished quests were then made by Sonda Schapson, Worthy Matron. Worthy Grand Matron Betty Swisher and Worthy Grand Patron H. Fred Smith from Indiana Grand Chapter were with us to celebrate the occasion.

Our story begins in early January, 1889. It was night time and very cold. All day long a snowstorm had been raging; show was drifted, roads were impassable and foot travel was an almost impossibility. A family living on the southwest corner of Center and High streets had partaken of their supper and retired to the living room where we find a glowing fire in the grate, a table put up ready for a game of euchre, and it seems the family is set up for a happy and undisturbed evening. Those present were William Conrad, his wife Mamie, their daughter Rose and her Husband Frank. The game had begun when sounds were heard on the side

porch as if someone was seeming to struggle and being bewildered. Without opening the door, William called, "Who is it? What is wanted?" A woman's voice answered "It is I, please let me in." The door was quickly opened and with a gust of blinding snow and wind, in blew a woman who had come to plant the seed.

On February 18, 1889, at a regular meeting of Lake City Lodge, Brother Conrad read a letter from Mrs. Fanning, Worthy Grand Matron of the Eastern Star of Indiana in regards to the organization of an OES chapter in Warsaw. appointing a committee and meeting on the next night, the committee enthusiastically recommended that an OES chapter be started in Warsaw and it was unanimously agreed upon. On May 7th the chapter was constituted and the officers regularly installed by Sister Emogene Mower, the real founder of Warsaw Chapter, OES. At the close of 1889 they had 54 members and at the close of 1913 there were 228 members.

Our chapter has had Sisters who have served the Indiana Grand Chapter and many Sisters and Brothers who have been very active in positions and offices with the Grand Chapter and also in our chapter. Without these people continuing the principles of Eastern Star there wouldn't be a Warsaw OES Chapter.




